



## Mask Statement:

As part of the Governor's Executive Order, all individuals over ten (10) years old must wear a face covering over their nose and mouth when entering or moving within any Public Indoor Space until at least August 15.

The order requires people in Colorado who are 11 years and older to wear a covering over their noses and mouths:

- When entering or moving within any public indoor space.
- While using or waiting to use public (buses, light-rail) or non-personal (taxis, car services, ride-shares) transportation services.

People who do not have to wear a mask include:

- People who are 10 years old and younger.
- People who cannot medically tolerate a face covering.
- Children ages 2 and under should NOT wear masks or cloth face coverings.

[What does it mean to be unable to medically tolerate a face covering?](#) Essentially, this means a person who has trouble breathing or anyone who is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the cloth face-covering without assistance, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The TCHD Amended Public Health Order links to CDC guidance which includes '[Considerations for Wearing Cloth Face Coverings](#)' stating:

*"People who are engaged in high intensity activities, like running, may not be able to wear a cloth face covering if it causes difficulty breathing. If unable to wear a cloth face covering, consider conducting the activity in a location with greater ventilation and air exchange (for instance, outdoors versus indoors) and where it is possible to maintain physical distance from others."*

In an effort to comply with Tri-County Health orders, we recommend families adhere to the order when participating in specific Tri-County Health areas, however, we understand the restrictive nature of wearing a mask while exercising may limit one's ability to feel medically safe. Thus, we will not punish any player that feels physically, mentally, or emotionally unsafe wearing a mask while participating on the field indoors or outdoors in a Real Colorado activity. We will also provide access to our medical staff should families desire further guidance regarding the appropriate use of face coverings for their player(s).
